Rethink Purchases and Use

- New or Used Needs or Wants
- Sustainable products Reduce plastic/less packaging
- Reduce single-use plastic

Food Recovery & Distribution



Rethinking Waste

Most Preferable

Refuse

- What waste can be avoided completely?
- Refuse items that will go to the landfill, including single use items like plastic straws, take out containers and cups.

Reduce

- What waste can be reduced?
- Plan meals to reduce the amount of potential food waste in your home. Use less soap, toothpaste or other personal care products.

Reuse

- What materials can be reused, repurposed or repaired?
- Reuse containers to store food. Repair buttons and zippers on clothing. Take
 appliances and tools to be repaired. Use cloths or towels instead of paper towel.

Recycle

- What materials can be diverted for others to use?
- Refer to your local municipal recycle information to find out what can be diverted. This can include electronics, cardboard, glass containers and some plastics.

Rot

- What materials can be composted?
- Compost at home or through your city's compost program.


