# What brought us here?

Charism

Curiosity--need for clarification: "Is this [the Proposal] a 'done deal?' --or can we construct and deconstruct, playing with a workable model? Are we [ET] jumping ahead? Is ET out of their lane? --the threads of the Proposal go all the way back to Viable Possibilities documents. This [Proposal] is not about Leadership, it's about Community. It's about\_being together into the future. Our job [in response to this Proposal] is 'to question' [discernment].

ET's charge is to 'Engage Broader Community in the establishment of the Community-Based Leadership Group.' The Community's charge is to imagine this model and respond--give feedback, but it appears to be a proposal of what we have to do, by some.

Can we revitablize the Community Assembly to do this work? What is the goal of this experiment? How do we measure it? The table Hosts (concept) of allows a mini-lead role.

Time/Talents/Treasure commitment is needed by Consociates.

THE PROBLEM (Consociate speaker): 170 Consociates but many are not engaged (+- 30% are).

Need to work on the relationships/format that invites those people who are missing.

Concern about the weakness of the relational "web" of the Consociates— The Sisters cannot do this work for the Consociates. It is the Consociates' work to strengthen this web.

Our mission work together is important; check-ins and relational being are equally important.

Silos--how do we make Community more open?

Extend invitation to more; extend expectations.

Reach out to those who are missing? How?

"If you fear change, leave it here!" (change jar at Mayday Cafe)

**The "Common Table"**, in my view, already exists in the Community Assembly. How can we better operationalize it there:

- to build/deepen relationships and mission commitment across/throughout the community via experience-based storytelling
- Community Assembly Commissions (Relationship and Association, Justice, Ministry) share their mission/current action focus in 3-4 sentences – at each assembly (we have done this, helpfully, in the past); encourage Commissions to sugges how and where and how partnerships with neighbors are strong and can deepen...
- Actively, creatively promote participation, (including comp time for staff participating ( is Saturday the best day to meet?
   Would a survey help better-determine this?)
- Give significant Assembly time to a particular CSJ/consociate ministry/relationship group

i.e., Agregees, staff members, with intent to inform, share their mission-connection, living and deepen relationships with others

With 4-5 community assemblies a year, community can come to know ministries,

departments, and Individuals better and more personally, experientially...

Identify already existing small conversational groups, their purpose and, as possible

membership and meeting time/frequency.... Seek their permission to share this information and their willingness to share any other info from group meetings;

Recognize publicly and actively support with admin. resources necessary the great

work of the Community Assembly Planning Committee and call attention to its potential, broad-Based make-up and membership.

I support the Content section as is. This can be achieved within all Assemblies as well as small groups meeting for heart-sharing, justice learning and promotion and, soon, DEI and B experience-based learning

**Community, Relationships and Belonging** may be more internal, and at the same time, also have indirect, positive external effects. And **Collaboration, Mission and Solidarity** may likewise have powerful internal as well as external effect

- B.**Network** of small groups . This doesn't eliminate some of the commission but many of us don't find that as a vehicle for involvement. I would wonder about a list in small groups about new ways such as book groups and other feedback that has been received C.**Build community** through ritual and other methods. Again I would wonder about small groups listings ways
- 5. After small groups have listed specific ideas I would think about using a tool like dotmoracy. that is where each area has list of ideas and than

people are given dots and can select either 3 or 5 that are their top choices in each area. Than the top choices become the action area. You can do this on zoom as well as a doodle poll.

Last I would have sign up sheets at each table asking for a person area if interest as a way to begin to formulate how to implement these steps.

## What energizes you to keep coming back here?

- The Charism/Mission, which puts into words what I have felt all my life
- Envisioning religious life in the future how this will encompass all, not just the "vowed"
- We're really going back to earlier times, when women came together to figure out how to truly be present in the world, in ways that could help everyone make things better
- Appreciate that Community-Based Leadership (CBL) is inclusive and representative and a flowering of the structures that we already have ("commissions" "assemblies")
- Excited to come together again after the separation during Covid times; even willing to drive over a half hour on a night when snow was possible, just to be together again
- Commissions have not always provided a connection to community
- Beguines¹ laywomen are a good example of what may be coming
- Spiral images of growing and connecting
- More committee work is beyond me now as I age. Yet I show up to support those doing the work. I show up because I love so many people here, as well as the Charism and Mission, which are part of me and the "Interconnected web of all that is and of which we are a part"<sup>2</sup>
- Imagine using what is working, leaving behind what is not, and remembering our stories
- There were many changes over time with the CSJs, including structures being placed on the women from the Church, and structures being challenged later. Those challenges after Vatican II were difficult for many who were conditioned to having answers, predictability, authority and hierarchy

- We don't want to throw out what is working, but the way the Community Assembly (CA) is functioning is not what was envisioned – more of one-time seminars rather than ongoing connections with the needs of the world
- The CA has been working for some people and not for others
- Appreciation for the ongoing theme of connection and belonging
- Relationship-building is hard to do; the CA has helped foster that work
- CA helps foster a spiritual community
- It feels like focus has largely been on belonging within the CSJ Community; is that enough?
- Came to the CSJs to be part of a group of amazing women (with some men added over time) to raise up the world, engage actively with others in the world
- Trying to add something to a CA agenda is very difficult, often cannot be done
- The CSJ's Charism and Mission has been sending some of us out into the world, to places we would not otherwise have been; how do we bring those connections back to the CSJ Community?
- How will Consociates' work become part of the CSJ Community –
  e.g. the wonderful Food Access Hub, Laundromat (<u>Beautiful</u>
  <u>Laundrette</u> which has upcoming community events!)
- Appreciate that the "Common Table" would allow people to bring to the CSJ Community what our missions are in the world
- Stories and ideas that Consociates and all connected to this Charism and Mission are doing is important for Sisters and all in the CSJ Community to know about
- Could help bring together the connections with the "Wider We" that we are missing
- We need to develop a culture of gratitude for each other and for how we are allowing the Charism and Mission to move in each of us

- How we live our lives is a way of social justice with gratitude for community, for each other, at the beginning, middle and end of our work
- Appreciate that the Engagement Small Groups could be a place where we share stories and break down "silos"
- Building Community and Mission through Stories could help us reach out and build connections among ourselves and other people
- Keep evolving take the ideas and perspectives and then just start and see what happens, what evolves and from what
- Invite existing commissions/committees to host discussions at the bi-monthly meetings
- Know that this proposal will continue to evolve as we evolve trust in the work of the Spirit, the Charism and the Mission to lead us

- The proposal will take a lot of leadership, meetings don't just happen, it needs leadership to bring it about
- The charge is to create that leadership group
- Puzzled by the whole thing, not sure how the proposal relates to the forming of the leadership group
- Disbands some existing leadership without replacing it
- What was brought forward today is one of the function of the community-based leadership group
- Cart before the horse
- What is the leadership about, what will this leadership group be commissioned to do

# Name your mission/interest/circle that you are involved with, where are you carrying the CSJ mission.

- Bothered that there was no discussion of the first small group question
- This question asks us how we live out the charism
- Hard to name individual items, like Bread and Roses, ICOM, R&A Commission, but mission is part of everyday life
- Why are we doing this?
- Day to day interactions with people
- Eucharistic minister at Hennepin County Medical Center
- See some people who are difficult to see, interact with people that are difficult for me to interact with, the commitment I make helps
- Serve on Sister Assembly Coordinating Committee
- Meeting with people I don't ordinarily hang out with, being an active listener
- On the Leadership Team Council
- Zooming in when there are community events, staying connected from a distance
- Governance Committee
- Agrégeé
- But I don't belong to any group that would have input to agendas for the "common table"
- Hard to find pathway back for discussions that happen in these groups around the community

# Reflections (in Zoom chat) from the open mic sharing time:

- It sounds like magic is going to happen. Who will do the planning of the common table meetings and who charged them to do it
- If it is the community based leadership group, who are they and what authority will they have?
- This all sounds good, but it is missing a foundation
- The community based leadership group will include people from all of us, sisters, consociates, friends
- We need a common project to get to know each other, navel gazing, just getting to know each other without a project, will not be meaningful
- Our common purposes bring us to know each other
- While I respect these concerns, part of me resonates with the idea
- As a candidate I got to know people by going to the assemblies in the dining room, finding a table, engaging casually, eating lunch. In the course of that social engagement, a relationship began.
   While projects help us bond, just getting to know each other helps us know where we came from, how we grew up, who our family is. I appreciate what they are trying to evolve here. Since the pandemic, meetings have felt empty, without that casual social learning about one another.
- Can we address both concerns?
- That feeling of coming together, getting to know people, is part of how we operate any time we meet. But the pandemic interrupted our usual operation even as it gave us the gift of bringing distant participants to our table.
- Who is going to do this planning? Is it the engagement team? Who will authorize them to do this work?
- Who will keep doing this planning as the sisters can no longer come and as the consociates can no longer come?
- Sometimes leaders come first, sometimes vision comes first
- I don't see plans for a leadership group there
- I really believe the CSJ Forum, properly managed, could do a lot to shore up this weak communication web that is being described.

  The forum can be a real planning and communication tool.
